about our institution



The University of Houston–Victoria, founded as an upper-level, off-campus center in 1973, is one of four institutions in the University of Houston system and the only institution offering bachelor's and master's degree programs within a 100-mile radius of Victoria, Texas. The primary role of UHV was to provide upper-level and graduate programs for students within the Coastal Bend region

The University expanded its outreach efforts in 1996 with the opening of two multi-institutional teaching centers at Cinco Ranch and Sugar Land in Fort Bend County. The purpose of this collaboration was to expand access to quality higher education courses and programs. As technology improved, faculty began to teach via ITV and online. In January 2002, the George Building opened at the UHS Sugar Land site. In 2009, Governor Rick Perry signed legislation (HB 1056) that expanded the University's mission to include freshmen and sophomores. During Fall 2010, UHV enrolled its inaugural class of freshmen.

UHV is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award bachelor's and master's degrees.

academic programs

The University of Houston–Victoria offers more than 60 bachelor's and master's degree programs and concentrations in the arts and sciences, business administration, education and human development, and nursing fields. UHV provides accredited, face-to-face and online programs to students in the Gulf Coast region and beyond. For nearly 40 years, UHV has given students quality, higher education opportunities taught by exceptional faculty at a great value.

career services

The mission of University of Houston–Victoria Career Services is to guide students and alumni in career planning, to provide workshops and training to help link students with employers, and to serve as a resource for professional development in students' desired fields.

- **CareerLink!:** Allows employers to post jobs, register for career events, request on-campus interviews, and search student and alumni resumes.
- **Life After College Series:** Provides employers the opportunity to participate in panel discussions with students about careers and career trajectory.
- **Career Fairs:** Creates opportunities for employers to meet with upcoming graduates and recent alumni to find the right candidate for their companies.
- **Information Sessions:** Allows representatives to conduct individual presentations to interested students about their organization, the benefits of working for them, and the application process.
- **On-Campus Recruitment:** Lets employers use our event management system, CareerLink!, to organize and conduct interviews.
- **Part-Time Job Fair:** Creates an avenue for employers to meet every fall with incoming students who are looking for part-time employment.
